There are only a few questions – do you know the answers?






When should you arrive at your bus stop?

5 to 10 minutes early

Right on time

THE ANSWER IS:

When should you arrive at your bus stop?

5 to 10 minutes early

The bus cannot wait for you. It is best to be ready and arrive at your bus stop a little bit earlier than the bus is scheduled to come.



You should always get on the bus:

running and playing with friends

in a single line, and hold onto the hand rail

walking backwards



THE ANSWER IS:

You should always get on the bus:

in a single line, and hold onto the hand rail

Wait for anyone in front of you to climb onto the bus.

Be sure to hold onto the hand rail

- those stairs are big!



When you are on the bus you should:

face backwards, and yell to your friends

eat snacks and leave your school bag in the aisle

sit forwards, with your bag on your lap, talking quietly





THE ANSWER IS:

When you are on the bus you should:

sit forwards, with your bag on your lap, talking quietly

Always stay seated, with your school bag on your lap, or next to you on the seat.

Food is not permitted on the bus.

Please use your inside voice on the bus!



If you drop something under the bus you should:

run and get it right away

tell the bus driver and ask for help if you need it

leave it



THE ANSWER IS

If you drop something under the bus you should:

tell the bus driver and ask for help if you need it

Let the bus driver know, and ask for help.

Never go under the bus.



When it's time to get off the bus you should

wait until the bus is stopped to get up from your seat

grab your backpack and walk to the front of the bus

wait at the top of the stairs until the driver tells you it's safe to cross the road

all of the above



When its time to get off the bus you should

THE ANSWER IS

all of the above

Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before getting up from your seat. Always walk on the bus. When getting off, wait for the bus driver to help you know when it's safe to cross the road.
